# Finding Indian Solutions to Indian problems...

# First Population based Breast Cancer Screening Programme in Andhra Pradesh

To ensure early detection of breast cancer, particularly underprivileged women who cannot afford a Screening Mammogram, Ushalakshmi Breast Cancer Foundation (**UBF**) has embarked upon implementing a simple, inexpensive and viable Community based Breast cancer Screening Programme in partnership with the **Govt. of Andhra Pradesh**. The Programme was launched by Mrs Minnie Mathew, Chief Secretary, Govt. of Andhra Pradesh (August 2012). I 200 Health Care Workers from nine Mandals in Hyderabad District were trained in August & September 2012 to perform Clinical Breast Examination (**CBE**), a screening method to detect early breast cancer. Some 50, 000 women between the ages of 35 – 65 years will be screened for early signs of breast cancer.
